Saturday, June 6: Fairbanks

Alaska's "Golden Heart City" of Fairbanks is a great introduction to the heart of this unique state. Check in to your hotel and get ready for the beginning of your adventure.

Sunday, June 7: Denali Princess Wilderness Lodge

A cruise along the Chena River on a Sternwheeler Riverboat is about as authentic as it gets. Later, you'll head for Denali National Park via a scenic motorcoach trip to the Denali Princess Wilderness Lodge. Check in with the Guest Service Desk for help in planning your own Denali adventure. Or you may enjoy the spectacular main lodge, river view deck, and Princess Village with the popular Christmas cottage and sugar shack. Be sure to check out Fannie Q's Saloon, named after a famed local homesteader.

Monday, June 8: Denali Princess Wilderness Lodge

You have a full day to get out into one of America's best national parks. This afternoon, explore Denali National Park on a Natural History Tour, watching for glimpses of Denali as well as Denali's "Big Five"; moose, caribou, bears, wolves and Dall sheep.

Tuesday, June 9: Mt. McKinley Princess Wilderness Lodge

This morning, depart via motorcoach to the Mt. McKinley Princess Wilderness Lodge. Sit and gaze at "The Great One" from the lodge's treehouse, hear stories about climbing Denali in the Hudson Theater or roast marshmallows at the fireside patio.

Wednesday, June 10: Whittier

After a morning enjoying the lodge, transfer to the historic town of Talkeetna to board our exclusive Direct-to-the-Wilderness Rail service for the journey to Whittier and your waiting ship.

Wednesday, June 10: Anchorage (Whittier), Alaska 8:30 PM Embark

Whittier, located 65 miles southeast of Anchorage, was a World War II port until 1960. Today, its economy relies on fishing, tourism, and the Anton Anderson Memorial Tunnel, the longest highway/rail tunnel in North America. Named after poet John Greenleaf Whittier, it's also the gateway to Prince William Sound.

Thursday, June 11: Hubbard Glacier (Scenic Cruising), Alaska 3:00 - 8:00 PM

The "Galloping Glacier," the largest tidewater glacier in North America, is advancing towards the Gulf of Alaska, forming a natural dam that closed off nearby Russell Fjord. Hubbard Glacier, 76 miles long, plunges 1,200 feet into Disenchantment Bay, offering stunning blue hues and a prime viewing spot for calving icebergs. The area is also renowned for wildlife, including whales, harbor seals, otters, brown bears, moose, and seabirds.



Friday, June 12: Glacier Bay National Park (Scenic Cruising) 9:15 AM - 6:15 PM

Glacier Bay National Park, located west of Juneau, is a UNESCO World Heritage Site with stunning tidewater glaciers like Margerie Glacier. During a scenic cruise, friendly Park Rangers will share knowledge and host a Junior Ranger program for kids. Enjoy an unforgettable day sailing through the park, showcasing emerald waters and calving icebergs.



Saturday, June 13: Skagway, Alaska 7:00 AM - 8:30 PM

Skagway was a hub for gold seekers in Alaska and the Yukon, offering the shortest route to the Klondike. However, the White Pass route and the steep Chilkoot Trail were more challenging. By 1898, Skagway was Alaska's largest town, with a population of 20,000. However, gold yield declined in 1900, leading to a shift to new finds in Nome. Today, Skagway has less than 1,000 residents but still retains its gold rush era flavor.

Sunday, June 14: Juneau, Alaska 6:30 AM - 4:00 PM

In 1880, Joe Juneau and Richard Harris discovered gold in Alaska, leading to the discovery of three of the world's largest gold mines. By the end of World War II, over \$150 million in gold had been mined. Juneau, founded by Juneau, became the capital of Alaska and the gold business was replaced by government. Today, Juneau is known for its beautiful glaciers and stunning views of water and mountains, making it one of the world's largest towns.



Monday, June 15: Ketchikan, Alaska 10:00 AM - 6:00 PM

Ketchikan, Alaska's "First City," is the first major community destination for travelers heading north. Originally an Indian fishing camp, the name comes from a Tlingit phrase meaning "eagle with spread-out wings." In the early 1900s, gold mining led to the establishment of fishing and timber industries, making Ketchikan Alaska's fourth-largest city. The city's rich Native heritage, including the world's oldest totem pole collection, and its abundance of salmon make it a popular sportfishing destination.

Wednesday, June 17: Vancouver, Canada 7:30 AM Disembark

During the gold rush, "Gassy Jack" Deighton built a saloon in Gastown, which became the shanty town of modern Vancouver. The provincial government changed the town's name to Vancouver after Captain George Vancouver, who sailed the region in 1792. Today, Canada's third-largest city, Vancouver is a cosmopolitan city with a European feel, a rich ethnic mix, and stunningly beautiful parks, including the second-largest Chinatown in North America.


